*Here are some prayers you can use with your child(ren):*

### **Prayer When Making Memories with My Baby Sister/Brother**

### **Prayer for My Baby Sister/Brother**

I know you love *(name)* \_\_\_\_\_ even more than I do, so I trust that your plan is best, whatever happens.

### **Prayer of Gratitude for My Baby Sister/Brother**

Dear God, thank you for creating my baby sister/brother, *(name)* \_\_\_\_\_. Thank you for giving *(name)* \_\_\_\_\_ life. Thank you for the time we have with *(name)* \_\_\_\_\_. I want to always remember this beautiful gift.

# Making Memories

Here are some ideas for ways you can make memories during the life of your baby.

- Mark on a map each place you go as you make memories as a family, perhaps finding a small memento each time and saving them in a memory box.
- Take photos of each place you go, print them, and put them in a scrapbook. Also take photos and video of everyday life during that time.
- Read, or have the baby's older sibling(s) read, their favorite book to the baby. You can video them doing so and make an inscription in the book.
- Have each child write a letter or draw a picture for the baby and put them in the memory box.
- If you knit or crochet (or know someone who does), make a matching set of hats for the baby and all the family members.
- Press flowers and leaves from the seasons of your baby's life and put them in a scrapbook. You can also use the pressed flowers to decorate mementos later.
